A DAY AT FALLS CREEK

Here is a brief explanation of what takes place at Falls Creek on a daily basis:

QUIET TIME: 8:40-9:00am

This in-cabin time is designed for students to be alone with God. A short Quiet Time guide based on the theme of the day will be provided for students in the student book.

IN-CABIN BIBLE STUDY 9:00am-10:15am

In-Cabin Bible study and challenge is a cornerstone of Falls Creek. We will meet in our cabin for an in depth study through our camp theme. Our FBC Mustang Pastors come down and teach the Bible Study each day and spend time with the group.

MORNING WORSHIP SERVICES 10:30am-12:00pm

Middle School and High School students will meet together in the tabernacle to worship beginning at 9:45am. This time includes worship through song, the camp video series, and theme based teaching.

RECREATION 1:30-5:30pm

Falls Creek provides more recreational options than any person or group could possibly do in a week. Tournament recreation is held at Riverfront Recreation Field with the exception of Ping-Pong, which will be held at the pavilion adjacent to SwiftSkate Park. A variety of other individual and group recreation options are available throughout the afternoon. Breakouts are also available throughout free- time.

EVENING WORSHIP SERVICE 7:30-9:00pm

The Evening Worship Service is the culmination service each evening. Energetic praise, preaching, and public invitation (Tuesday - Friday) make this service one of the signatures of the Falls Creek experience.

EVENING CABIN DEVOTIONAL 10:15pm

Our evening In-Cabin time is a favorite at Falls Creek. We have theme nights that students dress up for and compete in games and activities each evening. We also have a guest worship leader lead us in song and wrap up the day with a devotion and small group time led by our sponsors.

AROUND THE GROUNDS

ART PROJECT

BUS TRANSPORT

Busses are available Tuesday-Friday from 12:45-5:30pm. They pick up every 5-10 minutes at Price's Falls, Riverfront Recreation Area, Main Gate, and Jordan Welcome Center.

BIBLE TREK

Each afternoon, in addition to missions mobilization, students will have the opportunity to deepen their biblical knowledge and grow spiritually through guided walks through scripture. Students can connect with program staff at the Missions Center for Bible treks.

PIN TRADING



DRESS CODE

All apparel judgements will be left to the discretion of the Falls Creek Staff (FCS). If FCS determines a camper or campers should change their clothing to fall in line with camp requirements, then said camper or campers are required to do so.

ALWAYS ACCEPTABLE SHIRTS

Shorts must extend to or just beyond the campers' finger tips.



Dresses/Skirts must reach the top of the knee.



Shoes must be worn at all times outside of your cabin.



T-shirts and cover-ups must be worn to and from swimming venues.

Should wear swimsuits of modest length (fingertip) and not tight fitting

No short shorts/ or tight-fitting shorts

No two-pieces
Campers may not be barefoot on the way to and from venues.

SWIMWEAR

Tights may be worn (under a garment that meets the dress code. Tights/sliders do not extend the length of garments worn over them (short/skirts/dresses). **Tights are not pants.** No tight fitting or revealing clothing. This includes leggings or similar attire, which cannot be worn as pants.



No tank tops or shirts cut down the sides.



Undergarments must always be covered by outer garments (i.e. no boxer shorts hanging out or bra straps showing).



No Midriiffs/racer backs. No sport bras as tops (includes the 5K).



No spaghetti strap tank tops/dresses.

Apparel may not display tobacco, alcohol, controlled substances, or inappropriate language or pictures.

WHAT NOT TO WEAR

CODE OF CONDUCT

All campers are expected to follow Falls Creek and FBC Mustang's Code of conduct. All rules and sponsor instructions should be followed at all times.

The dress code must be followed, but we acknowledge that modesty extends beyond the dress code. As such, students should refrain from PDA (Public Displays of Affection).

Cell Phones will be allowed at camp but will be taken up daily and will be restricted to afternoon free time only. Use of cell phones during any other time will be grounds for loss of the phone for the remainder of the week.

Hazing, pranks, sexual harassment, and abusive speech or actions toward others is strictly prohibited.

Students may receive consequences for rule breaking or be dismissed from camp and a parent/guardian will be required to pick up and take the student home.

Zero Tolerance

Any student in possession of a zero tolerance item will be immediately dismissed from camp and a parent/guardian will be required to pick up and take the student home.

Zero Tolerance Items:

Falls Creek Youth Camp 2021 Student Release and Waiver of Claims Form (2 of 2)

I understand that it is the responsibility of my child's Host Church to obtain insurance permission for treatment or to limit my child's recreational activities because of a stated medical condition.

My child, _____ will be attending Falls Creek Youth Camp during the summer session, 2021. Falls Creek Conference Centers are managed and operated by the Baptist General Convention of Oklahoma ("Oklahoma Baptists"). In the event that my child should need emergency medical care or attention, the Host Church leadership, Oklahoma Baptists or any of their agents or employees is hereby authorized to consent to the provision of such emergency medical care, including without limitation, medical, dental, surgical care, or hospitalization, to my child as is recommended or suggested by a physician, nurse, surgeon, or other health care professional.

- If such emergency care is provided, I understand that my child's health insurance information will be given to the health care professional and that any expenses not covered by my insurance shall be my responsibility. I understand that the Host Church or Oklahoma Baptists will not be obligated to pay either the health care professional or me for any medical expenses incurred.
- There are instances when third party contractors are used to operate and supervise various events and activities. In those instances where third party contractors are used, I agree that neither the Host Church nor Oklahoma Baptists is responsible for the action of these third party contractors. I further agree that neither the Host Church nor Oklahoma Baptists is liable for the actions or activities of participants or sponsors participating in events or activities operated by third party contractors.
- I understand that the risk of injury from recreational activity is significant, including but not limited to, the potential for permanent paralysis and death. While particular rules, equipment, and personal discipline may reduce this risk, the risk of serious injury does exist. I knowingly and freely assume all risks, both known and unknown, even if arising from negligence, and assume full responsibility for my child's participation in or observation of such recreational activity.
- Furthermore, in consideration of my child being allowed to attend Falls Creek Youth Camp, I, on behalf of myself and my child, hereby waive, and I hereby agree to indemnify and hold harmless the Host Church, Oklahoma Baptists, their agents or employees, against any and all causes of action, rights, claims or suits which I or my child may have against the Host Church, Oklahoma Baptists, or their agents or employees as a result of injury to my child, including, but not limited to: (1) injuries arising from my child's participation in or observation of recreational activities at Falls Creek Youth Camp, and (2) injuries arising from the decision of the leadership of the Host Church, Oklahoma Baptists, or any of their agents or employees to consent to the provision of emergency medical care to my child.
- I understand that my child's image may be included in a video or in photographs that may be made during camp. I understand that a promotional or highlight video may be available for sale during and after camp. I consent that my child's image may appear on videos, promotional resources, camp endorsed web sites, etc.
- I give authority and permission to the Host Church, Oklahoma Baptists, and any of their staff or agents to inspect my child's belongings while at Falls Creek Youth Camp.
- I understand that Falls Creek Youth Camp is a place where many students seek counsel and advice from adult leaders, staff, counselors and others. I hereby consent to my child receiving spiritual and emotional counsel during their week of camp.
- I have received and read the Parent Information about Falls Creek Youth Camp including the list of the recreational options and the daily schedule, and I have received satisfactory answers to all my questions about such information. I have read the Falls Creek Youth Camp Code of Conduct and Dress Code, and I have discussed the Code of Conduct and dress code with my child.
